



Workshop on "Communication Skills" – A Gateway to Effective Teaching

The Al-Barkaat Institute of Education has organised one-day workshop on "Communication Skills" was held on 9th April 2025, with the aim of equipping future educators with essential communication tools and techniques vital for success in the teaching profession.

The session was led by Dr. Rubina Shahnaz, Principal of



ABIE, whose extensive experience and insightful guidance enriched the learning experience. The workshop witnessed active participation from **B.Ed. first and second-year students**, reflecting their eagerness to strengthen their professional competencies.

The central objective of the workshop was to enhance the **communication and presentation skills** of the participants—skills that are foundational not only in classroom instruction but also in broader academic and professional engagements. Psychology Practical Activity: Exploring Creative Thinking

The Department of Education at Al-Barkaat Institute of Education organized an engaging **Psychology Practical Session** for **B.Ed. I-year students**, focusing on the application and scoring of standardized psychological tests used in educational settings.

The **Bhatia Battery of Intelligence Test** and the **Teaching Aptitude Test Battery** by **Singh & Sharma** were administered and scored. These tests provided the students with hands-on experience in assessing intelligence and teaching aptitude—two critical areas in educational psychology that contribute to understanding learner diversity and professional suitability in teaching.

The practical session, conducted on **8-9th April 2025**, was organized under the expert supervision of **Dr. Tabassum Qamar, Psychology Lab In-charge, ABIE.** Under her guidance, students actively participated in scoring, interpretation, and result analysis, developing essential skills in psychological testing, data recording, and interpretation of results.
